#### Dear Parents,

It is wonderful to have all our children back into school this week. It is natural for everyone to feel anxious after another long period of time out of school. However, just to reassure you we continue to keep our children safe in their class "bubbles" while focusing on a "Recovery" style curriculum that will help the children through fun and play to engage again with learning.

At Saint Vincent de Paul we have been very fortunate to have minimal cases of COVID 19 in our school. To help us to maintain this we need your continued support in a few important ways:

- Your child should not come to school any earlier than their allocated time, P4-P7 can go straight through to their class <u>ONLY at 8.45am</u>, Nursery at 9.00am ONLY through Legburn Street, and P1-P3 at 9.00am ONLY through the main school gate. <u>Please do not come any earlier as this will cause</u> <u>congestion.</u>
- Parents should not be in school unless by prior appointment
- If you need to speak to Mrs McVeigh or your child's class teacher please contact the school by telephone, email or through SEESAW
- Parents/Guardians/Carers are encouraged to wear face coverings in school grounds and when waiting to collect their children
- Please practice safe, social distancing while dropping off or picking up your child from school
- Please do not congregate at the school gates

Remember, primary-age children should be supervised at all times when online.






Online games are social activities, and most have features that allow children to chat with others whilst they play.
